

SUSAN is the City of Lubbock's substance use disorder network for community health workers. SUSAN allows case managers and community health workers to increase linkage, and retention, in substance use, mental health and medical services for Texas residents living in Region 1 with substance use disorders.

Eligible Populations – Individuals with substance use issues, adult men and women

Services provided by SUSAN screen for and address social determinants of health by providing the following: Provide harm reduction methods and tools including but not limited to:

- svringe cleaning kits
- overdose reversal kits including Naloxone
- Condoms, Lubricants, and safer sex tools
- Wound care kits
- Hygiene kits
- Pre-Exposure Prophylactic (Prep) education information

#### Financial assistance with:

- Residential and Outpatient Treatment for gualifying individuals
- Detox for gualifying individuals
- Transportation to appointments
- Prescription medication
- Vision hearing
- Clothing
- Personal hygiene
- Sober housing
- Employment and educational needs

### Prevention Resource Center, Region 1: Panhandle and South Plains

Prevention Resource Centers (PRCs) are programs funded by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) to provide data and information related to substance use and misuse, and to support prevention collaboration efforts in the community.

Prevention Resource Centers have four fundamental objectives related to services provided to partner agencies and the community in general:

- (1) collect data relevant to the state's prevention priorities and share findings with community partners
- (2) ensure the sustainability of a Regional Epidemiological Workgroup focused on identifying strategies related to data collection, gaps in data, and prevention needs
- (3) coordinate regional prevention trainings and conduct media awareness activities related to risks and consequences of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs (ATOD) use

(4) conduct voluntary compliance checks and education on state tobacco laws to retailers
